Australian Chamber of Commerce in Hong Kong celebrates 37 Years with Prestigious Community Awards & 'Destination Hong Kong' Theme

Hong Kong's Financial Secretary & ANZ Global CEO Honour Milestone Event

HONG KONG, 19 June, 2025 --- The Australian Chamber of Commerce in Hong Kong (AustCham) proudly celebrates 37 years in Hong Kong and announces 2025 Community Award Winners.

Guests of Honour Financial Secretary of the Hong Kong SAR, Paul Chan Mo-po; the Global CEO of ANZ Bank, Nuno Matos and Australian Consul-General to Hong Kong & Macau Gareth Williams, joined over 200 members and guests from the Australian and Hong Kong business community at the Conrad Hotel to celebrate 37 years since the establishment of the Chamber in Hong Kong and to recognise and highlight the achievements of the 2025 Australia-Hong Kong Community Awards winners.

The AustCham 37th Annual Dinner and 2025 Community Awards themed 'Destination Hong Kong' celebrated nearly four decades of fostering Australia-Hong Kong business ties and recognized outstanding contributions to the community. AustCham and its members have been a cornerstone of the growth of the bilateral business landscape, driving trade, investment, and cross-cultural collaboration. The 37th-anniversary celebration underscores the Chamber's enduring commitment to supporting its members and strengthening the economic partnership between Australia and Hong Kong.

The Chamber was formed in 1987 with around 20 corporate members and many more individuals, due to the growing mass of Australian business professionals in Hong Kong at the time. Now representing more than 900 members and over 280 companies, the Australian Chamber of Commerce has evolved from a regular business lunch club to the largest offshore Australian chamber and one of the most influential international business organisations in Hong Kong.

Almost four decades on, the Chamber's diverse membership is a cross-section of start-ups, NGOs and large corporates across all industries and expertise. Today AustCham supports not only Australian businesses but also Hong Kong investors who provide capital and investment into Australia. The Chamber supports connectivity between Australia, Hong Kong, and the Greater Bay Area. AustCham is one of the leading chambers of commerce in Hong Kong,

playing an active role in promoting the extensive trade, investment and people-to-people links between Australia and Hong Kong. Hong Kong is home to Australia's second largest expatriate community, and Australia's largest commercial presence in Asia, covering legal and financial services, construction and engineering, education, F&B, technology and more.

Australian Minister for Trade and Tourism, Senator, the Hon Don Farrell, said in a video message "...Each of you make a huge contribution to building commercial ties between Australia, Hong Kong and the wider region," adding "We are significant trading and investment partners for each other, and Hong Kong is the home to the Australian largest overseas business community anywhere in the world". He finished his message saying, "congratulations AustCham for the work that you do in furthering Australia's relationship with Hong Kong."

Australia's Consul-General to Hong Kong and Macau, Gareth Williams said "AustCham plays a special role in our bilateral relationship, making a fundamental contribution to the longstanding commercial and people-to-people ties between Australia and Hong Kong."

AustCham Chair, Josephine Orgill, said "Our 37th anniversary marks not just a milestone, but a testament to the resilience and vibrancy of the Australia-Hong Kong business corridor. We are deeply honoured to host Financial Secretary Paul Chan and ANZ CEO Nuno Matos – their participation underscores the strategic importance of this relationship. This year we are celebrating Destination Hong Kong – bringing people, capital and talent to this vibrant and exciting city. The Community Awards allow us to shine a light on the inspiring talent and commitment driving positive change across our networks. We look forward to celebrating our shared successes and building an even stronger future together.
